


Learning Styles—Teaching Styles

- a. Left Hemisphere
 - -Orderly/sequential
 - -Sees detail
 - -loves words/numbers
- b. Right Hemisphere
 - -Random/Global
 - -Sees Big Picture
 - -loves pictures/graphs
