2. An Architect at Work

Efficient learning and teaching follows a design Begins in mind of inspired teacher Lesson design has much in common with architecture Design must be placed on paper A teacher must keep in mind the purpose of lesson Design process requires vision The language must be common Lesson plan demands prayer and study Needs inspiration of the Holy Ghost Higher Planning commission

3. Curriculum Course Development

Start with a need Involve entire faculty Chose theme -chose title Chart progress Assign unit to member for Titles of Lessons Arrange in sequence Chose lesson 'Objectives', -focus Chose Scripture Text Assign lessons to individual writers

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4. Lesson under Construction

Formulate objectives for:

Learning

Student performance

Set realistic goals

Know nature of soil

Language must be common to teacher and student

Prepare site for construction

Begin at the beginning

5. Suggested Use of Printed Curriculum

Identify needs of students Select lesson to meet need Find a technique to transmit

Write rough draft

Make revisions

Rewrite plan

6. Suggested Planning Session

Pray -"Give me a clean heart"

Read Lesson material

Write out 'Lesson Objective'

Study Scriptures on subject

Make an Outline

Write Conclusion

Write Introduction

Choose Methods and stories, examples
