


The Laws of the Teacher

- No teacher teaches unless the student has learned
- The teacher must know
 - The subject
 - The methods of teaching
 - The students
- The teacher must prepare
 - The lesson
 - The minds of students to receive

The Laws of the Language

Words used must be common to both teacher & student

- Use simple, easy to understand words
- Speak slowly & enunciate plainly
- Use illustrations & visuals



The Laws of the Pupil

 Pupil must attend with interest in the content and meaning of the lesson

 Every student is in a different position of "readiness" to learn

 Teacher can do much to prepare the "heart soil" for the lesson

4 Enemies of Instruction

- Discomfort
- Distraction
- Disturbance
- Disinterest



The teacher has control of all but the last

Principles of Reinforcement

- Encouragement & praise will strengthen a behavior
- Criticism & punishment will suppress a behavior
- Ignoring a behavior will often eliminate it
- Reinforcing desirable behavior speeds learning - Madeline Hunter

Principles of Motivation

Madeline Hunter

- 1. Moderate increase of tension a concern
- 2. Generate & build on student's interest
- 3. Create a pleasant feeling tone
- 4. Successful learning inspires additional learning
- 5. Provide quick feedback of results
- 6. Relate activity to reward

The Law of the Lesson

- Teacher must determine student's level of knowledge
- Teacher must teach from the known to the unknown
- Teacher must teach from the natural to the spiritual



The Law of the Level of Difficulty

- New material must be within a student's ability to comprehend
- New task must not be too difficult
- New task must not be too easy
- Adjust expectation to the level of each student



The Law of the Learning Process

- New material must be meaningful to the student
- Student must be able to see how material can be applicable to his or her life
- New material must be seen as practical & useful

The Law of Memory

- Learning takes place in an emotional setting
- To strengthen memory, one must recall information often
- To be remembered, information must be meaningful
- To be remembered, learning should be a pleasant experience
- Daily quizzes are more powerful than final exams

The Laws of Practice

Madeline Hunter

- Practice that which is correct
- Make material vivid
- Give positive reinforcement
- Develop friendly feeling tone
- Involve students in own learning
- Provide quick knowledge of results

The Laws of Practice

Madeline Hunter

- Limit guidance to what students cannot do
- Place difficult near the beginning of practice
- Vary the sequence of list

The Paths of Learning

- Five senses
 - Use as many as possible
 - Retention
 - Reading 10%
 - Hearing 20%
 - Vision 30%
 - Vision + Hearing 50%
 - Oral Repetition 70%
 - Teach (Say-Do-Use) 90%



The Main Goals of Learning
